PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Purpose of the Great Lenten Fast

The Great Lenten fasting for Christians is to prepare us for the awesome celebration of Easter Sunday commemorating Our Lord's Resurrection. During this season, called Medz Bahk, we give ourselves to mental and spiritual growth to better understand why we fast and what we should do to improve the quality of both our physical and spiritual lives.

This is experienced by our custom of fasting from foods, pleasures of life, ordinary daily routines, and by increasing our spiritual life of prayer, good works and charity.

Our fasting is for...

- Experiencing hunger...to remind us it is Christ God who truly satisfies us
- Experiencing emptiness...to remember The Lord who fully fills us in soul and body
- Experiencing deprivations...to remember Our Creator who provides for all our needs
- Experiencing self-sacrifice...to remember Jesus who sacrificed Himself on the Cross for us
- Thinking more about what is true and less about the pleasures in life...to remember what the real treasures in life are when we gain a fuller life in Christ—then 'our treasure becomes our pleasure.'

Fasting and abstaining are ways of seeing people and our possessions in a different way, especially when we sometimes take for granted the value of friendship, companionship and being blessed to have what we do.

In keeping the Great Fast / Medz Bahk for 40 days, we will see the fruits of our sacrifice and 'experience' our 'becoming' a renewed person with a Christ-like and heavenly attitude. This year, Great Lent begins on Monday, March 3 with Palm Sunday on April 13. The goal is to emerge from this season of penance with a new outlook on life, through what we say, our charity, our discipleship, and our stewardship.

Bemkar Designation Marker Donation


Not completely known to most, but in the middle of the main Altar in any Armenian Apostolic church is a *bemkar*. This is a stone or marble, which is inserted in the

middle of the main level of the Altar with a cross insignia on it, and is consecrated. *It's a compound word for Bema, or Altar and Kar, for stone...Altar stone.* It is on this spot that we deliver and keep the Holy Gospel and the Holy Chalice during liturgy.



So during the liturgy, under the Altar covers, how do we know exactly where it is? Our parish now has four hand crocheted cross

donated by Manusak Terdjanian. Each cross has running through it the corresponding colors of our Altar covers (white, red, green and blue). Dgn. Manusak presented these crosses to Fr. Kapriel at the end of Divine Liturgy on February 2 for blessing as witnessed by our faithful. Thank you to Dgn. Manusak and all who offer for His Holy Church



From the Eastern Diocese

Patriarch of Jerusalem Honored at Alma Mater

New York's General Theological Seminary conferred an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree on His Beatitude Archbishop Nourhan Manougian, the Armenian Patriarch of Jerusalem, on Thursday, February 6.

The ceremony was held at the seminary chapel & was attended by Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Diocesan Primate; Archbishop Vicken Aykazian, the Diocese's Ecumenical Director; St. Nersess Armenian Seminary Dean the Rev. Fr. Mardiros Chevian; other Diocesan clergy and St. Nersess seminarians. Archbishop Manougian, who is a graduate of General Theological Seminary, presented the Very Rev. Kurt H. Dunkle, dean & president of GTS, with a pectoral cross. A reception followed.

GTS is one of the Episcopal Church's leading educational institutions, and has a long history of friendship with the Armenian Church, having conferred graduate degrees on many Armenian clergymen.

Remembering our Patriarch

Sunday, February 9 was a day of remembrance & celebration, as the life and legacy of His Beatitude Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, of blessed memory, the late Jerusalem Patriarch and Diocesan Primate, was honored through a special requiem service at St. Vartan Cathedral, and at a luncheon in Haik and Alice Kavookjian Auditorium.

"Today is a day to reflect on a single man's life, spent in humble, devoted service to our church and our people; to Armenia, America, and Jerusalem; and to our risen Lord," said Diocesan Primate Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, in his homily. Our Primate remembered Archbishop Manoogian as "part of a remarkable generation of church leaders." As survivors of the Genocide, they had suffered like the rest of our people; but a greater power inspired them to lead."

Archbishop Torkom was "not only a talented priest, energetic Primate, or distinguished Patriarch," continued Archbishop Khajag, "but also one of the very few churchmen of his generation to carry the weight of our church on his shoulders. During his ministry, he often was the solitary voice of our community to the outside world. He always considered Jerusalem his home and finally returned as the 96th Armenian Patriarch."

The Primate added that they were privileged to have Archbishop Torkom's successor as patriarch, Archbishop Nourhan Manougian, present at the service, "bringing the spirit of Jerusalem to us. We will best honor Archbishop Torkom's life by continuing his mission ourselves today," he noted.

IN THE CHURCH

When you are attending the church service, let your apparel be appropriate and modest. Abstain from adornments and flashy clothing which are not suitable in a church setting, where a spirit of concentration and meditation is required as a precondition to participate in a communal prayer.

As you enter the church, it is appropriate to cross yourself. It is also an age long Armenian tradition, just as it is customary in Eastern Orthodox and Catholic churches too, to light a candle as a way of placing yourself in a contemplative mood.

The lighting of the candle is also a symbol of the sacrifice of the self and the radiance of Christian's love . Just as the candle burns and is consumed to spread light, so must every Christian man and woman live to radiate love, light and warmth. It is a genuine Armenian custom of piety to light the candle in front of an anointed picture of a Saint, to pose for a moment, and breathe a prayer of self-dedication and to prepare oneself spiritually to participate in the church service.
